

# 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 15th, 2015

Near the end of her life, Saint Therese of Lisieux grew in her understanding of, "the intrinsic connection between the first and the second commandment. It is relatively easy to love people who are far away, to pray for missionaries, etc. Loving those who are close to us is more difficult, but this is what the genuineness of our love for God will be judged on!" (Philippe, Jacques. *The Way of Trust and Love*. Scepter 2012. Page 107).

Saint Therese grew up in the context of a family and then lived in a community of nuns, hence she knew the human condition and the dynamics and difficulties of interacting with others. It was not through obtaining various advanced degrees that she became a Doctor of the Church, but through her deep understanding of divine love and truth.

She said, "Oh, now I understand that perfect charity consists of bearing with other people's faults, not being surprised by their weaknesses, but being edified by the tiniest acts of virtue we see them practice" (ibid. 107-108).

What a great virtue to work on, to be edified by the tiniest act of virtue we see in another!!
