Dear brothers & sisters in Christ,

If I had the intention of climbing Mount Everest, I would need to plan and prepare well. Proper training, equipment, and food would be necessary, among other things. Using reason, we realize that an endeavor like this would not be possible without such resources. Spiritually, there must come a point when we realize that we cannot make the journey to Heaven on our own strength. It is not possible. This can be hard because it is counterintuitive in a culture that prides itself on self-accomplishment, the attitude that I work hard, I achieve, and I have done well for myself.

The spiritual life is opposite of this cultural approach. The Lord ordered Elijah, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you! He got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb" (1 Kgs 19).

It is only with God's strength, and with what He can do within us, that we can keep climbing the spiritual mountain to Heaven. This means that we need to be humble enough to receive God's help! Every week we receive Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist. This is our food for the spiritual journey to strengthen us on the way.

Our wounds and our weaknesses as Father Mike Schmitz said to a large group of youth at the Steubenville North Conference this year, can be doorways for God to enter our heart. Then in our weakness we realize we are strong and that it is God leading us home to Himself. He is our strength, He is our reward!!

Q & A

On August 15th, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. What lessons should we learn from this?

A friend recently discovered the joys of golfing. He bought a set of clubs, all the right equipment and learned the rules of the game. But he could never quite hit the ball far enough or straight enough. One day he had had enough and decided to take a few lessons. He discovered that what he was doing was wrong, and after mimicking a good swing over and over again, he finally hit the ball better.

Holiness is much the same way. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in the public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "the virgin Mother of God was taken up into heaven to be the beginning and the pattern of the Church in its perfection, and a sign of hope and comfort for your people on their pilgrim way."

It is this pattern of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God's grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.

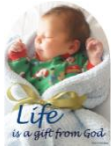

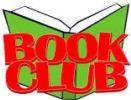
