Once again a powerful healing! "Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him" (Mark 1:21-28).

Jesus has the authority and power to heal for He is God. He spoke, and His words were effective, they accomplished the message they conveyed immediately.

Is Jesus still present to us as He was to the people in Palestine during the first century? Yes He is even if we haven't experienced a miracle such as those recorded in the Gospels in which the people were amazed.

"There are weaknesses God frees us from, but others he leaves with us, precisely so that we stay small and poor, dependent on his grace, compelled to keep calling out to him all the time" (Philippe, Jacques. *The Way of Trust and Love*. Scepter, 2012. Page 47).

Here then is a path to great freedom which God desires for all of us in Christ. "Sometimes he heals our weaknesses, but sometimes he gives us the grace to live with them trustingly, to accept them peacefully, and accept ourselves as weak and limited" (ibid. 47). This in itself can be a great miracle.
