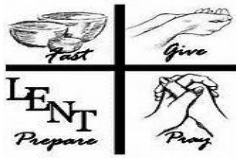


# 3<sup>d</sup> Sunday of Lent, March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we are only four weeks from Easter and three weeks from Holy Week. How is Lent going so far? Wherever we are in our Lenten and spiritual journey, now is the time to open ourselves to the grace of the season.

There are some practical things to consider. Lent is a beautiful time to attend daily Mass. We have Mass Tuesday through Saturday morning at 8am. Additionally, there are many Mass times offered throughout the metro area, morning, noon, and evening. Hearing the readings and receiving Holy Communion is very helpful in turning away from sin and turning to God! Another way to enter into Lent is to go to Confession. This is clearly a way for us to turn away from sin and to turn back to God. We have Confessions at Saint Nicholas Tuesday through Saturday. Even if you work during the week, Saturday morning Mass at 8am, followed by Confessions, is a fantastic way to enter into the season of Lent. Cultivating a spirit of repentance and prayer through the Liturgy leads to a fuller engagement of the season. We are more readily disposed to follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit when we are rooted in the Eucharist and when we ourselves have received God's mercy. Currently we are working through the GROW survey results, the survey that many of you filled out. One area that came up in the discussion is evangelization. How do we evangelize? One simple way is to invite. We can't force the Gospel on anyone, but we can invite them to join us for daily and Sunday Mass. I'd like to see a few more people in the pews, and much of that depends on your ability to evangelize and to invite!!
