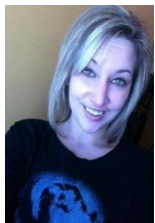


HE IS RISEN, ALLELUIA!

Alleluia! Christ is Risen. He is Risen indeed!

Each year on Holy Saturday during the Easter Vigil, many are baptized into the Catholic Church along with receiving the baptized seeking full communion with the Church. Parishes welcome these new Catholics through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

This year we welcome and congratulate Britny Ash Bollar who celebrated the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil. Britny has been in a RCIA formation class since September and you may have seen her as she has participated in the different rites at our weekend liturgies throughout the year as she has prepared for the sacraments.



Please welcome and support her in our prayers as a new member of the Catholic Church and our parish community as our RCIA faith formation classes continue into the period known as mystagogy, which means "interpretation of mystery", or "to lead through the mysteries". Mystagogy is the time of post-baptismal catechesis and a time to reflect on receiving the sacraments as well as ongoing formation of the faith. The newly baptized are called "neophytes," from the Greek word meaning "new plant," because the

faith has been newly planted in them.

As the formal catechesis draws to a close in the month of May, there is still much to learn as our spiritual life is a life-long faith journey. This is true for all of us as God calls us to grow in holiness and participation in the life of the Church, which can help us to evangelize. This is a time to plant the seeds of faith in our work environments, in our families and community and invite others to consider the Catholic Church. May the seeds you plant grow into many "new plants" at future Easter Vigils!
